


Participants will analyze the opportunity offered by "accessible OER" and how it relates to their local context





Reminder: Functional Definition of "Accessible"

Accessibility is shaped by what we need to do, our interactions with the environment, and our personal preferences. From the Office for Civil Rights, accessibility is when...



acquire the same information **engage** in the same interactions **enjoy** the same services in an equally effective, equally integrated manner, with substantially equivalent ease of use

...as a person without a disability.


