DAILY SCHEDULE

These assignments will be due the following day. These assignments will be graded on completion.

Late homework assignments will not be accepted unless the child was absent the previous day.

TESTING

Math- Students will take the Math MAP test three times this year, fall, winter, and spring to measure individual growth. Also, students will take the Ohio State Math Test on April 17th and 18th.

ELA- Students will also take the Reading MAP test three times this year. The Ohio State Reading Test will be given twice on October 18th and 19th and April 9th and 10th. The state of Ohio has a Third Grade Reading Guarantee. Please be on the lookout for more information from your student's ELA teacher about this law.

ALL ABOUT MATH/SCIENCE/SS

Math:

Fluency of math facts will be a daily part of our math routine. We will be reviewing addition and subtraction facts at the beginning of the year; although, your child should have mastered the basic addition and subtraction facts in second grade. This year your child will also be responsible for mastering the basic multiplication facts and their corresponding division facts. Please work on these facts with your child nightly using flashcards or other games!

Our math program is very rigorous and designed to match Ohio's Common Core standards. Your child will be tested over each unit using a district assessment. Grades will be given based on homework completion, graded classwork, quizzes, and district assessments.

Social Studies/Science:

Your child will receive letter grades on his/ her report card for social studies and science each grading period. Please utilize the review sheets and daily assignments that will be sent home to help your child understand the concepts we are studying and to prepare for any end of unit tests.



ALL ABOUT LANGUAGE ARTS

Fairfield uses a language arts program called Fountas & Pinnell. Fountas & Pinnell is a balanced literacy program. Each day, your third grader will be exposed to high quality fiction and nonfiction literature. There are several components to this program, which include: interactive read alouds, shared reading, guided reading, independent reading, phonics and word study, and writing.

To prepare for the Third Grade Ohio Reading Test, your third grader will be taking several digital reading assessments on Edcite.

It is recommended that third graders read 15-20 minutes daily. Additional time at home reading will help continue to develop your third grader's reading proficiency.
