We employ developmentally appropriate, medically accurate information within our curricula and are responsive and respectful to student questions and needs.

#### SENATE BILL 5395

In 2020, the Washington State Legislature passed Senate

Bill 5395, requiring schools to provide comprehensive

sexual health education beginning in grade 4 or 5 and to

teach Social Emotional Learning in Grades K-3.

### No new curricula was introduced in OHPS due to Senate Bill 5395.

Our sexual health curricula was adopted in alignment with *School Board Policy & Procedure 2020* and State Law. Sexual health curricula was adopted in 2005 (**Great Body Shop**); 2014 (**KNOW**); 2017 (**FLASH**).

\*Social Emotional Learning Curriculum was adopted in Spring 2020. The curriculum review team work began in 2018.



#### **Other Information**

**HIV/AIDS lesson(s)** are taught every year, beginning in grade 5.

#### OHPS is aligned to Erin's Law (SHB 1539, 2018):

• In the primary grades, the focus is on safe touch.

 In the secondary grades, the focus is on consent, online safety and sexual violence prevention, sexual harrassment, sexual abuse, and dating violence.

#### **EXAMPLE: Erin's Law Lesson**

#### 9th Grade FLASH Lesson 8 Key Concepts

- Everyone has the right to say who touches their body and how.
- It is never okay to touch someone else if they don't want you to, or to make them touch you.
- There are laws about sex that everyone must follow.
- Permission or agreement is required to engage in all sexual activity.

### Myth

Parents do not have the right to preview the curriculum or opt out.

Masturbation is taught beginning in kindergarten.

### **Fact**

Parents/Guardians can opt out of planned instruction in comprehensive sexual health and that decision is honored by OHPS.

This is incorrect. Kindergarten curriculum includes social emotional learning and safe touch only. Masturbation is not taught in any grade level.

### **Fact**

The law says instruction must be inclusive of all students. Lessons focus on identity, understanding, and respect.

No. The curriculum in OHPS did not change. We were already providing a comprehensive sexual health curriculum and in process of adopting a social emotional learning curriculum.

### Myth



Illustrations and descriptions of sexual positions are taught.



Sexual education encourages students to have sex.

### **Fact**



No. Images showing sexual positions would never be used nor are students provided with how-to instruction related to sex.



Research on on comprehensive sexual health education shows just the opposite.
