

Adult High School


- Earn your high school diploma



Santa Barbara City College University Transfer Center

- Community colleges are welcoming of all students
- Provides assistance with the transfer process to a four year university
- Help students understand the transfer process
- Understand the difference between UC, CSU, private and out of state schools
- Counselors specialize in transfer
- Dedicated Transfer Advisor focuses specifically on the transfer process and provides resources
- Two different programs specific to transfer(University Transfer Academy & Transfer Achievement Program) that help students develop education plans according to their educational goals
- UTA=Work with students interested in UC TAG/TAP=Underrepresented student population with a goal to transfer to a four year university



University Transfer Center cont....

- Departments often work collaboratively in providing a student a holistic education
- Is a place to explore majors if unsure of major or career goal
- Events/Resources such as: College Transfer Fair (date Wed. October 30th), University Representatives, in-person workshops, very robust Website: <u>https://www.sbcc.edu/transfercenter/</u>)
- Provides local students the opportunity to be close to home if they are not ready to leave
- SBCC Promise-Great deal!! two years of paid books, tuition, transportation fee & health fee
- 69 % of people in the <u>CCC system</u> are people of diverse ethnic backgrounds, 51% of CSU graduates came from a CCC and 29% of UC graduates came from a CCC
- Allows flexibility if student decides to change major or career goal
