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

What is the Story Producer App?






A tool that allows local language speakers to:

- Orally translate a story
- Share the video that is created

What is the Story Producer App?





- Story Producer (SP) app enables local-language speakers to make oral translations of nicely illustrated Bible stories.
- Then with one tap the app creates a local Bible story video that can be shared from phone to phone in the community.
- All on a basic Android phone.



What is the Story Producer App?



The app guides the user through 7 steps/phases:

- 1. Learn the story
- 2. Translate and revise
- 3. Community check
- 4. Biblical accuracy check
- 5. Record the audio with a good voice actor
- Create the video
- 7. Share the video from your phone

Navigation Grid of SP app









- Much easier to get started with the app compared with older versions.
 - Not forced to navigate and choose a working folder.
 - New stories can be installed with a simple download.
- Story Producer now works with story content you create in Bloom - Scripture Engagement, Literacy, Health books, etc



When to use SP app? - A



- When local language speakers want to orally translate a Bible Story or a Bloom Book
- When local language speakers would want to create Bible stories for Scripture engagement, and share the videos in their community.

When to use SP app? - B



- When Bloom books need to be communicated in the community for health programs, community development, etc.
- When there is a desire for Bible stories, but Scripture translation has not begun.
- When a translation program wants to promote their work.



When to use SP app? - C



- When literacy rates are low in a community
- When video communicates better than text.
- When an orthography is not yet established
- When the community prefers oral-only communication.



When to use SP app? - D



- When the internet is costly or not available
- When computers are not readily available to the community.
- When an Android phone is appropriate technology within the language community.







- It is easy to install, download stories, learn and use.
- The prepared stories already include images, image movement, story text, audio, and music.
- Videos can be easily shared from phone to phone (or distributed any way you want.)







- Only needs Android 7 on a phone or tablet
- The app and stories can be installed from Google Play or offline from an SD card. After installation, no internet is needed.
- The whole process of translation and checking is done using a single phone or android device.

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What hinders the use of technology tools in remote places?

Existing tools often depend on:

- 1. Computers
- 2. Internet
- 3. Expats

- 3. Expats



Maximizing the Reach of SP



The new vision for Story Producer:

- 1. Computers ⇒ Android
- 2. Interret ⇒ Offline
- 3. Expats ⇒ Ease of use & Training on the app

Demonstrate Popup Help Feature





Over 50 unique popup windows help the new user understand the working of the app.

SP app Options available





- Include local artwork on the Title slide
- 2. Replace the story images with local user images
- 3. Enable picture movement (pan and zoom)
- 4. Include background music
- 5. Include the story text as captions on the video
- 6. Disable images
- 7. At the end of the story, the user can create and include a local song to summarize the story



Mp3TrueEdit Audio editor







A free, add-on app called mp3TrueEdit allows you to edit audio from within Story Producer.

Available from ithinkapps.com







- Adjust the pan and zoom
- 2. Change the background music
- 3. Change the source LWC text and audio

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- In the finished video, the text does not highlight as it is being read
- 2. It cannot upload the translated story to Bloom
- 3. It cannot export as ePUB
- 4. It is not primarily a literacy tool like Bloom

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
