

Pima County Overdose Deaths (All ages)


Overdoses by Year





Pima County Heroin-Involved Overdose Deaths








Pima County Cocaine-Involved Overdose Deaths











Pima County Benzodiazepine-Involved **Overdose Deaths**






Pima County Overdose Deaths by Most Common Drug Type






Drug Overdose Heat Maps (2022 YTD)






Pima County Fatal Overdoses of Ages 0-19






Pima County Fatal Overdoses in 19 and Younger by Opioid Involvement

Fast Facts About Youth Substance Use

- Youth Fatal Overdose Facts 2021-2022
 - 100% of all accidental overdose deaths involved fentanyl
 - 69% of the accidental overdoses were solely caused by fentanyl
 - 31% of the accidental overdoses involved fentanyl and at least one other drug, such as methamphetamine, cocaine, alcohol and benzodiazepines.

- According to the 2022 Arizona Youth Survey
 - 16% of respondents said their parents or guardians had spoken to them about the dangers of fentanyl
 - 10% of respondents said it would be "sort of easy" or "very easy" to obtain fentanyl
 - 69% of respondents thought there was a "great risk" of harm from using fentanyl
 - 3% of respondents indicated that they have used fentanyl before

AZ YOUTH SUBSTANCE

STUDENTS MOST FREQUENTLY REPORTED HAVING EVER USED ALCOHOL (40%), ECIGARETTES (29 %), AND MARIJUANA (28 %), PRESCRIPTION (5 %)

A SMALLER PERCENTAGE OF YOUTH REPORTED USING E-CIGARETTES, ALCOHOL, MARIJUANA, AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS FROM 2018 TO 2020

MORE STUDENTS USED MULTIPLE DRUGS AT THE SAME TIME (E. G., ALCOHOL, PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS, MARIJUANA, AND OTHER ILLEGAL DRUGS)

MORE POLY USE (12 %) THAN PRESCRIPTION USE ALONE



YOUTH SUBSTANCE USE TRENDS

MARIJUANA CONCENTRATES



E-CIGARETTES



RX COUNERFIT PILLS



Concentrates is a broad term referring to all products that have been extracted from the marijuana plant. Tend to be especially potent, with THC levels documented at an average of about 40%-70% and reported to exceed 80%. These higher doses of THC are more likely to produce anxiety, agitation, paranoia, and psychosis.

Youth who use e-cigarettes may be more likely to smoke cigarettes in the future. Some e-cigarettes look like regular cigarettes, cigars, or pipes.

Some look like USB flash drives, pens, and other everyday items.

E-cigarette devices can be used to deliver marijuana and other drugs

Counterfeit pills like Percocet is often laced with other addictive and deadly drugs, such as fentanyl or heroin. However, fake "Percs" usually look just like real Percocet. But these fake pills do more than just cause addiction— they lead to <u>fatal overdoses</u>.

WHAT PROTECTS OUR KIDS?

REASONS FOR USING

To have fun
To deal with stress/sadness
To feel good

REASONS FOR NOT USING

Parents/Adult Disappointment
Illegal/Arrested
Bodily Harm



PROTECTIVE FACTORS

When youth are recognized and rewarded for their contributions at school, they are less likely to be involved in substance use and other problem behaviors.

When youth are given opportunities to participate meaningfully in important activities at school, they are less likely to engage in drug use and other problem behaviors

When parents and other family members praise or encourage activities done well by a child, youth are less likely to engage in substance use and other problem behaviors

PROMOTING PROTECTIVE FACTORS



INDIVIDUAL

At the individual level, evidence is strongest for the protective nature of self-regulation skills, relational skills, and problem-solving skills.



RELATIONSHIP

The well-being of parents and other caregivers, the presence of a caring adult, and positive relationships with peers improve a childs well being



COMMUNITY

A positive school environment, a positive community environment, and economic opportunities are important for the at risk populations



EVIDENCE BASED PREVENTION

Includes the adoption of programs, policies, or other strategies that have been evaluated and demonstrated to be effective in preventing health problems

Are the best practice solutions any community can implement

Prevention providers have to know the cultural beliefs, societal norms, and local attitudes towards substance misuse and mental health




ACES DEFINED

ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACES) ARE POTENTIALLY TRAUMATIC EVENTS THAT CAN HAVE NEGATIVE, LASTING EFFECTS ON HEALTH AND WELL- BEING. THESE EXPERIENCES RANGE FROM PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL, OR SEXUAL ABUSE TO PARENTAL DIVORCE OR THE INCARCERATION OF A PARENT OR GUARDIAN.




Adverse Childhood Experiences

Arizona Youth Ages 12 – 17

(Arizona Youth Survey, 2020)

- 61% have experienced one or more ACEs
- Most common?
 - 40% Parents separated or divorced
 - 33% Living with adultswho insulted you
 - 29% Living with an
- alcoholic Ethnic minority children have disproportionately higher share of 6+ ACEs

AZ ACES CONSORTIUM

THE ARIZONA ACES CONSORTIUM IS A COLLABORATION OF MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED INDIVIDUALS, STATE, COUNTY, AND PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS WORKING TOGETHER.

CERTIFICATION

The ACEs Consortium is growing its community of certified ACEs trainers that Provide trainings to spread the awareness of ACEs, toxic stress and resilience.

TRAININGS

Trainings for school staff, administration, and educators on the short-term and long-term impact of trauma

TIC SCHOOLS

To network, gather resources, information and knowledge, spread awareness of the impact of trauma, and increase support to ensure that children traumatized by ACEs succeed in school.



HARM REDUCTION

HARM REDUCTION IS A SET OF PRACTICAL STRATEGIES AND IDEAS
AIMED AT REDUCING NEGATIVE CONSEQUENCES ASSOCIATED
WITH DRUG USE.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

ILLICIT DRUG USE IS PART OF OUR WORLD
DRUG USE IS COMPLEX & MULTI- FACETED
QUALITY OF LIFE AND WELL- BEING
NON- JUDGMENTAL PROVISION OF SERVICES & RESOURCES
PWUD ROUTINELY HAVE A REAL VOICE
PWUD ARE THE PRIMARY AGENTS OF REDUCING HARM



ONE SIZE DOES NOT FIT ALL



Abstinence goals

- May Not Resonate
- Lack of Acknowledgment
- Perceived Effects of SU

Variations and inequities

- Inadequate In Addressing SU
- Limitation of Current Programs
- Limited Youth Perspective



Reasons to incorporate harm reduction in your youth programming...

...Must provide services to aLL youth in need especially those at the highest risk. Failure to use Harm Reduction excludes many youth with the greatest need of service

HARM REDUCTION WITH YOUTH



PEER TRUST

Centering Youth Experiences & perspectives

RESOURCES & ENGAGEMENT

Engaging youth in community OD outreach and community support

PEER SUPPORT

Young people who have successfully navigated life challenges promoting belonging, hope and empathy to their peers

REDUCING STIGMA

Educate students about smashing the stigma of addiction to drugs and alcohol to eliminate shame and change public opinion

WHAT IS USED TO REVERSE AN OVERDOSE

NALOXONE IS A SAFE DRUG, AND IT IS DESIGNED ONLY FOR THOSE WHO HAVE AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

GROWING CONCERNS ABOUT STUDENT OPIOID USE AND FENTANYL SPECIFICALLY

NALOXONE CAN QUICKLY REVERSE AN OVERDOSE - AND SAVE LIVES




