## **WWII** Photo Retouching Challenge



#### **Create a Moodboard**

- 1. Create new document (File>New)
  - a. **Name:** WWII-Moodboard, Last,first name
  - b. **Size**: W: 1920px H: 1080px
- 2. Place images into moodboard (File>Place Embedded)
- 3. Resize and move images to group common ideas.
  - a. To resize, use the "**Free Transform**" tool (Ctrl+T)
- 4. Export as a .JPG (File> Export>Export As)



## **Create a group of Swatches**

- 1. Open the Swatches panel (Window>Swatches)
- 2. Click the "create new group" icon in the bottom right corner
- 3. Title Group Name (i.e. Army Uniform) and click "ok"
- 4. Using the eyedropper tool (i), select various colors to be reused in your final design
- 5. Click on the "create new swatch" icon
- 6. Name swatch color and click "ok"
- 7. Repeat for other colors and/or groups



### Separate Areas of the Photograph

This assignment will require that you save selections for separate areas of the photograph.For the image to the right, I've separated the image the image into 5 distinct sections.

By creating these saved selections, we are able to paint more easily. Each selection acts as a container that does not let a color accidentally stray into an area it does not belong. These layers are also *non-destructive*.

# **Object Selection**

Select your subject (Select> Subject).

If Photoshop has trouble identifying the subject within a particular image, you can use the "Object Selection Tool" within the toolbar. This allows you to select your subject by firstly selecting the range you'd like Photoshop to look at and then Photoshop will analyze and select the subject/object within that range. For more information on Object Selection view <u>this tutorial.</u>



## **Mix and Modify Selections**

Make sure that each selection is precise. (look for stray areas where your edges don't match the image's). You can use multiple selection tools within each selection.

#### **QUICK SELECT**

Quickly "paints" a selection using an adjustable round brush tip. As you drag, the selection expands outward and automatically finds and follows defined edges in the image.



#### LASSO


The Lasso tool is useful for drawing freeform segments of a selection border.


# SUBTRACT FROM A SELECTION ADD TO A SELECTION Hold [OPTION] (Mac) or [ALT] (PC) while making a selection Hold [SHIFT] while making a selection

## Save your selection

After selecting the respective section, save your selection within the Channels panel.

You can then load your selection by click on the "Load Selection" icon or holding "Ctrl" and click on the thumbnail (black&white image)







#### UNDERSTANDING THE LEVELS Adjustment tool

Levels is a tool used to adjust brightness, contrast, and tonal values of a photo. Levels uses a image histogram to adjust the values of these qualities by shifting the range of complete black, complete white, and midtones on the graph. An understanding of the use of levels will help you to better represent tones in your final image.



Maximize the values within your image to improve the *form* of your photograph (the 3-dimensional quality of your image).
