Communication of 6th Grade Progress

Schoology will be the best way to check your child's academic progress

- Schoology is the Learning Management System (LMS) for the middle and upper school grades.
- This is where **students/families in grades 5-12** go for...
 - Materials
 - Resources
 - Grades
 - Assignments
 - Feedback
 - Attendance and more!
- If you are new to School you will receive hard copy of Parent Access Codes by Sept 20

Throughout the year you will have opportunities to review your child's academic progress **ONLINE on Schoology** (real time), meet with your child's advisor in a **Student-Led Conference** (Quarters 1 + 3), and will receive a **hard copy of the Report Card** (Quarters 2 + 4)

- You will also receive a **"This Month In 6th grade"** and advisory email each month, but can feel free to reach out in between with questions!

Academic Support in 6th Grade

If child is struggling academically, they will be flagged via the Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) Process:

- If your student is identified as a **Tier 2** student in need of more support in Math or ELA services, your child may receive support during the classroom block or Study Hall by a classroom teacher or <u>Ms. Johnson</u>, our MS Interventionist
- If your student is identified as a **Tier 3** student, who is underperforming based on our internal diagnostics, <u>Ms.</u>
 <u>Johnson may</u> provide Math and ELA services during Study Hall or within the classroom block as part of our intervention program
- Based on their rate of progress during interventions, they may be referred for **EC services** in which a team + family will work to create an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) for the student.



Academic Support in 6th Grade

- **IEP:** Provides services (Academic, Speech, OT), modifications, and accommodations based on a disability or diagnosis that interferes with a student's ability to access the general education curriculum. Evaluations are required to qualify.
 - If your child has an IEP for academic services, Ms. Gonzalez may provide Math, ELA, and/or Social Emotional Learning time;
 - If your child qualifies for related services, <u>Ms. Asack</u> (Speech) or <u>Ms. Ormsby</u> (OT) will provide the service time.
- 504 plan: Provides classroom accommodations based on your child's medical diagnosis in accordance with Section 504; if your child needs these accommodations, reach out to <u>Ms. Jordan</u>, MS Counselor.
- **EL plan:** Provides services and accommodations to Multi-Language Learners who are in need of English Language (EL) learner plans.



Wellness Support in 6th Grade
