





Before sharing or spreading any information:




Ask yourself ...

- Is this news reported elsewhere?



5 Things to Do to Avoid Passing on Fake News

READ




- Don't just read the headline!
- READ the entire article
- Decide if it's believable
- Do more research if needed

Look at the Date



- Is this recent news?
- Did it happen long ago, but is just being re-shared now?

Google It!



 Can you find a second or third <u>credible</u> source?

Look it up on Snopes.com



- Snopes does the research for you
- Snopes will tell you if the rumor is true or false
- Still do some research on your own!

Know your

satirical websites



- Satire = using humor to criticize and expose foolishness
- The Onion is satire, NOT REAL
- Check realorsatire.com
- Many sites are intentionally creating false news for humor. Know how to spot it!



BREAKING NEWS CONSUMER'S HANDBOOK

- 1. In the immediate aftermath, news outlets will get it wrong.
- 2. Don't trust anonymous sources.
- 3. Don't trust stories that cite another news outlet as the source of the information.
- 4. There's almost never a second shooter.
- 5. Pay attention to the language the media uses.
 - "We are getting reports"... could mean anything.
 - "We are seeking confirmation"... means they don't have it.
 - "[News outlet] has learned"... means it has a scoop or is going out on limb.
- 6. Look for news outlets close to the incident.
- 7. Compare multiple sources.
- 8. Big news brings out the fakers. And photoshoppers.
- 9. Beware reflexive retweeting. Some of this is on you.

- Who made this?
- How was this made?
- Why was this made?
- When was this made?
- What is this missing?
- Where do I go from here?
