Applying To & Paying For College FINDING YOUR FIT

- → College Comparison Chart I will update and add more institutions in the Fall.
- The following websites allow you to filter colleges by various characteristics to identify matches: <u>CFNC</u> (NC), <u>Common App</u> (US and international member institutions), <u>College Board's Big Future</u> (US) and the <u>US Dept of Ed's College Scorecard</u> (US).
- → Compare your transcript with the profile of your potential colleges' admitted freshmen. For example, NC State's weighted high school GPA for the middle 50% is 4.15-4.47.
- → The UNC-system admission offices are unable to provide on-campus tours during COVID-19, but you can see them in virtual reality.
- → While on the UNC colleges' websites, search Early College or CIHS (Cooperative Innovative High School) for information specific to you.
- → Get to know the colleges' culture by following them on social media.
- → Attend Haywood County's annual College Fair in September (online beginning 9/14).

TRANSFERABLE CREDITS

- → NC's community colleges have an 'articulation' agreement with the UNC-system to accept credits earned with a "C" or higher. To view your unofficial HCC transcript, log in to WebAdvisor, and navigate to Academic Profile.
- → We try to give you a head-start by aligning your HCC classes with bachelor degree plans during every semester's individual advising appointment.
- → If outside of the UNC-system, each college's website will outline its policy/process.

APPLYING: Admission applications generally open early to mid-August. If you choose to start them before our HEC Senior Family Night, please consider the following:

- → If applying to NC colleges (public and private), complete <u>Residency Determination</u> first (for in-state status); use your CFNC username and password to log in. Wait until August as it is valid for one year and must be in effect at enrollment.
- → Most of you will apply First-year (versus Transfer).
- → Applying Early 'Decision' is binding, which means you will enroll if admitted.
- → A complete application includes the online application (on college's website or through CFNC, Common App or Coalition), fee, high school and college transcripts and college entrance test scores.
- → Edit for correct spelling/punctuation.
- → Use a personal (professional) email address for all college/scholarship correspondence. Your HCS and HCC accounts will close after you graduate.
- → My email address is hallen@haywood.kl2.nc.us for electronic transcripts, school reports, etc. Please wait to request *printed* transcripts and ACT/SAT score reports until I can explain the process.
- → If eligible for free/reduced-price school meals, ask Dr. Allen about fee waivers.
- → NC's College Application Week will be October 19-23. These schools waived their application fees during this week in 2019.

PAYING

- → We will discuss financial aid in August since there is little to do now.
- → You can skim this year's Scholarship/Opportunity Database on HEC's website under Counseling Center to identify scholarships for which you qualify, how to apply and deadlines.
- → The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opens October 1st and is based on your family's 2019 tax returns. This application begins the process for need-based aid and is required for some scholarships. If COVID-19 or other events have impacted your family's income in 2020, you can request additional consideration from individual colleges later.
- → Attend Haywood County's annual Financial Aid Night mid-Fall (TBD).
