

#### 2024-25 Incoming Student Immunization Requirement

All students must meet requirement for TDAP immunization in order to attend school on August 14, 2024. There is no grace period/extension to receive the vaccine after school starts.

Submit proof of vaccine to current school as soon as possible:

- 1 dose of Tdap, Adacel, Boostrix
- Date of vaccine must be given on or after 7th birthday
- Proof considered printout from doctor or CA Immunization Yellow Card with student's name, DOB, vaccine name, date vaccine administered, name of clinic or doctor administering vaccination

- Chromebooks will be handed out Aug 7th after WEB and Aug 9th




## **Math Placement**

Students that perform in 6th grade assessments at or above the **85th percentile** on RUSD MAP assessment will be given the opportunity to take **Accelerated Math** in the 7th grade. Contact Ms. Lindsey (7th grade counselor) if you would like to opt out of Accelerated Math prior to the start of the school year.

Students coming from outside the district will take an RUSD MAP assessment in **August** to determine if they are ready for accelerated math.




## **Math Placement Chart**




## **Math Placement Chart - High School**




