COLOR


A principle of design concerned with the inclusion of <u>difference</u> in the elements of a composition to offset unity and add interest to a space.

A principle of design in which one element, or a combination of elements, creates more attention than anything else in a composition. This dominant element is usually a focal point.





Balance of SPACE

Balance

A principle of design referring to the arrangement of visual elements to create stability in a space. There are 3 types of these arrangements: ASYMMETRICAL, SYMMETRICAL, and RADIAL.

of VALUE, SHAPE, and SPACE





Type of Balance: Symmetrical

(Also called "Formal Balance")

This is when the object is "weighted" the same on both sides of the work.



Type of Balance: Asymmetrical

(Also called "Informal Balance")

Elements are placed unevenly in the space, but balance each other out harmoniously.




Rhythm & Repetition

Using an element multiple times within the same space.

Movement

Repetition of an element, or the use of a continuous element of design, to direct the viewer's eye around the space.








Pattern

The repetition of an element, or combination of elements, in a <u>recognizable organization</u>.







Unity

A principle of design related to the sense of wholeness that results from using one of the elements similarly throughout the entire space.
