Geographical Description	Central Okanagan Basin
Area/ Trail Length	Park area 27.6 hectares
Seasons to Visit	Year-round; road to parking area at beach is closed in winter.
Habitat	Ponderosa pine, Douglas-fir, Cottonwood, grassland, lake shore
Viewing Highlights	Moderate trails through open woods and grassy areas. Birding in woods, on grassy slopes and on lake. Rock outcrops display volcanic features.
Other Features	
Main Access	Parking at beach at end of Collens Bay Road, accessed from Boucherie Road south from Highway 97 in West Kelowna.
Secondary Accesses	Trails may be accessed from Sunnyside Road to the south (residential area – parking may be limited) or Casa Loma Road to the north.

Cautions	Bears and cougars are rare but be watchful. Check for wood ticks in spring and early summer. Beach and lakeshore are not supervised.
Jurisdiction	Central Okanagan Regional Parks
Regulations	No camping or fires. Dogs on leash.
Facilities	Pit toilets at Collens Bay parking area. All services in West Kelowna and Kelowna.
Other Recreational Activities	Swimming, canoeing, kayaking, fishing
