Geographical Description	Southern Okanagan Basin
Area/ Trail Length	
Seasons to Visit	Year round; birding and botanising are best spring to autumn.
Habitat	Ponderosa pine, interior Douglas-fir, bunchgrass, pasture fields
Viewing Highlights	Good roadside birding in fields, woodlots, lakes and marshes.
Other Features	Interpretive signs and short loop trail at site of old Fairview townsite .
Main Access	West on Fairview Road 4.3 km west of Highway 97 in Oliver to Fairview townsite, then north on Willowbrook Road 11.4 to Green Lake Road. Or south from Green Lake Road, 12.5 km from Highway 97 in Okanagan Falls.
Secondary Accesses	

Cautions Bears and cougars are rare but be watchful. Wood ticks are common in spring; check yourself over thoroughly after visiting.
This is mostly private land; Keep to the roadside.
Cell phone service is not reliable in this area.
