Area/ Trail Length	Park size 768 hectares.
Seasons to Visit	Year round.
Habitat	Coastal redcedar/western hemlock, marsh, lake, riparian
Viewing Highlights	An important wintering and breeding area for marsh birds and waterfowl as well as forest birds and raptors. Approximately 9 km of trails in woods.
Other Features	
Main Access	8.2 km on Duck Lake Road (which becomes Haslam Lake Road), accessed from Sunshine Coast Highway (Highway 101), 0.5 km south from Myrtle Point Golf Course south of Powell River or 22 km north of Saltery Bay ferry terminal. Parking is along side of road by lake.

Cautions	Cell phone service is not reliable in this area. Duck Lake Road is a gravel road good for all vehicles but is an active logging road; use caution and watch for logging trucks.

Regulations	Dogs on leash. No camping or fires.
Facilities	None. All services in Powell River.
Other Recreational Activities	Swimming, mountain biking, canoeing and kayaking
Other Connections	A network of trails connects with the hatchery at the Lang Creek estuary
