All three RN ships were sunk by the German battlecruisers Gneisenau and Scharnhorst en route from Norway. There were only 3 survivors from 'Acasta', 3 from 'Ardent' and 43 from 'Glorious'. The squadron, HMS Ajax (Flag), HMNZS Achilles & HMS Exeter, fought the German pocket battleship Admiral Graf Spee. Ajax, Achilles and Exeter were all damaged. The squadron, HMS Ajax (Flag), HMNZS Achilles & HMS Exeter, fought the German pocket battleship Admiral Graf Spee. Ajax, Achilles and Exeter were all damaged.
