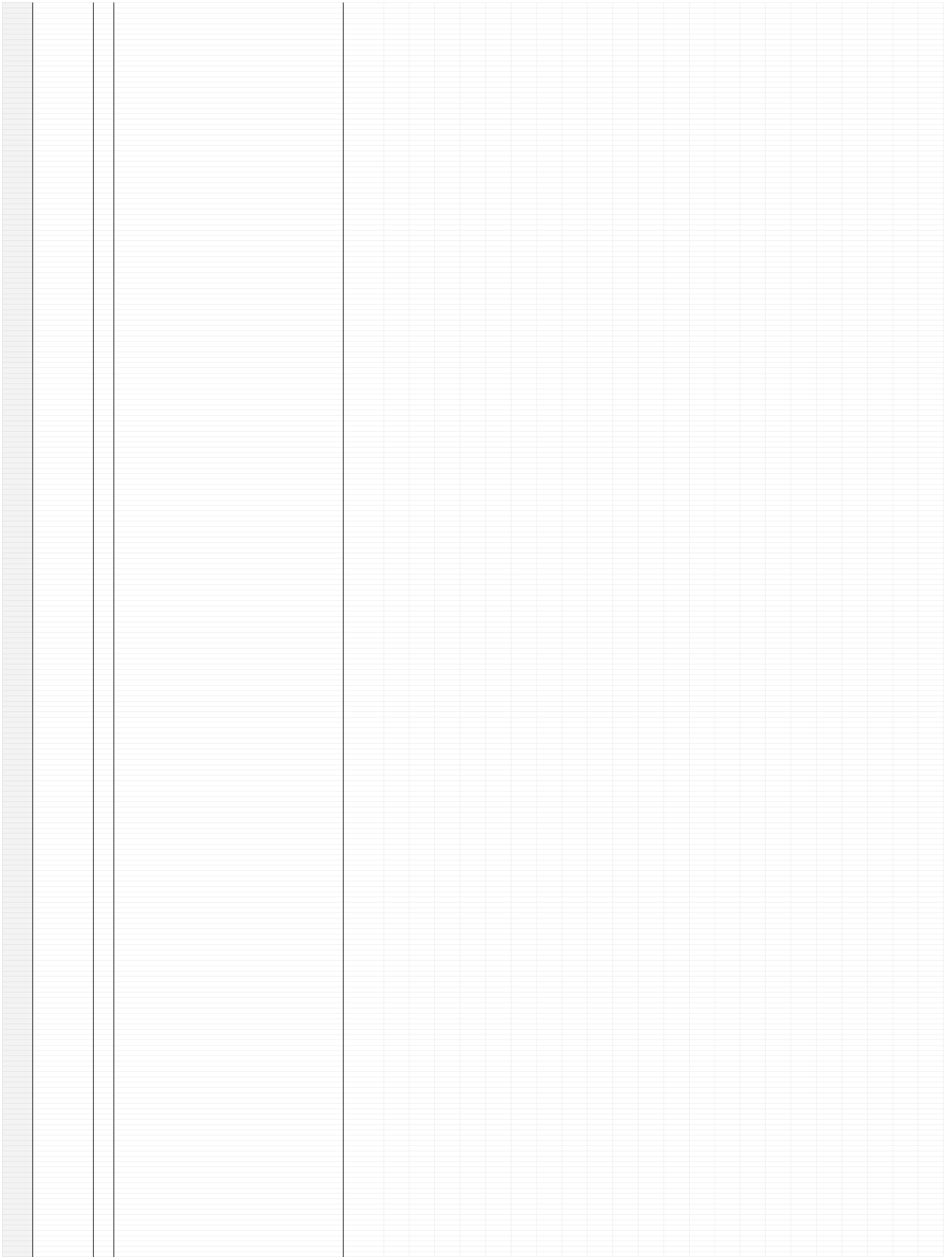
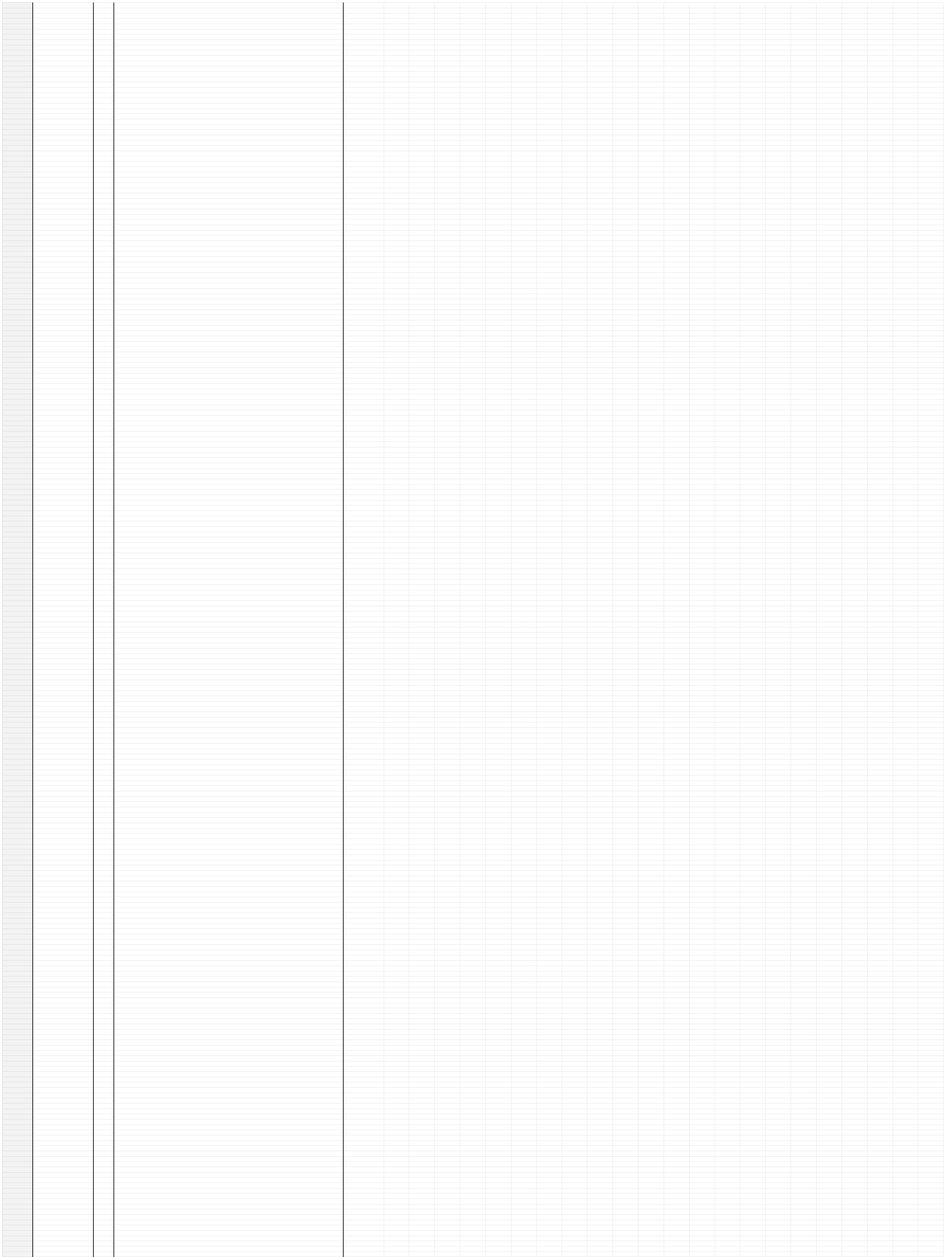
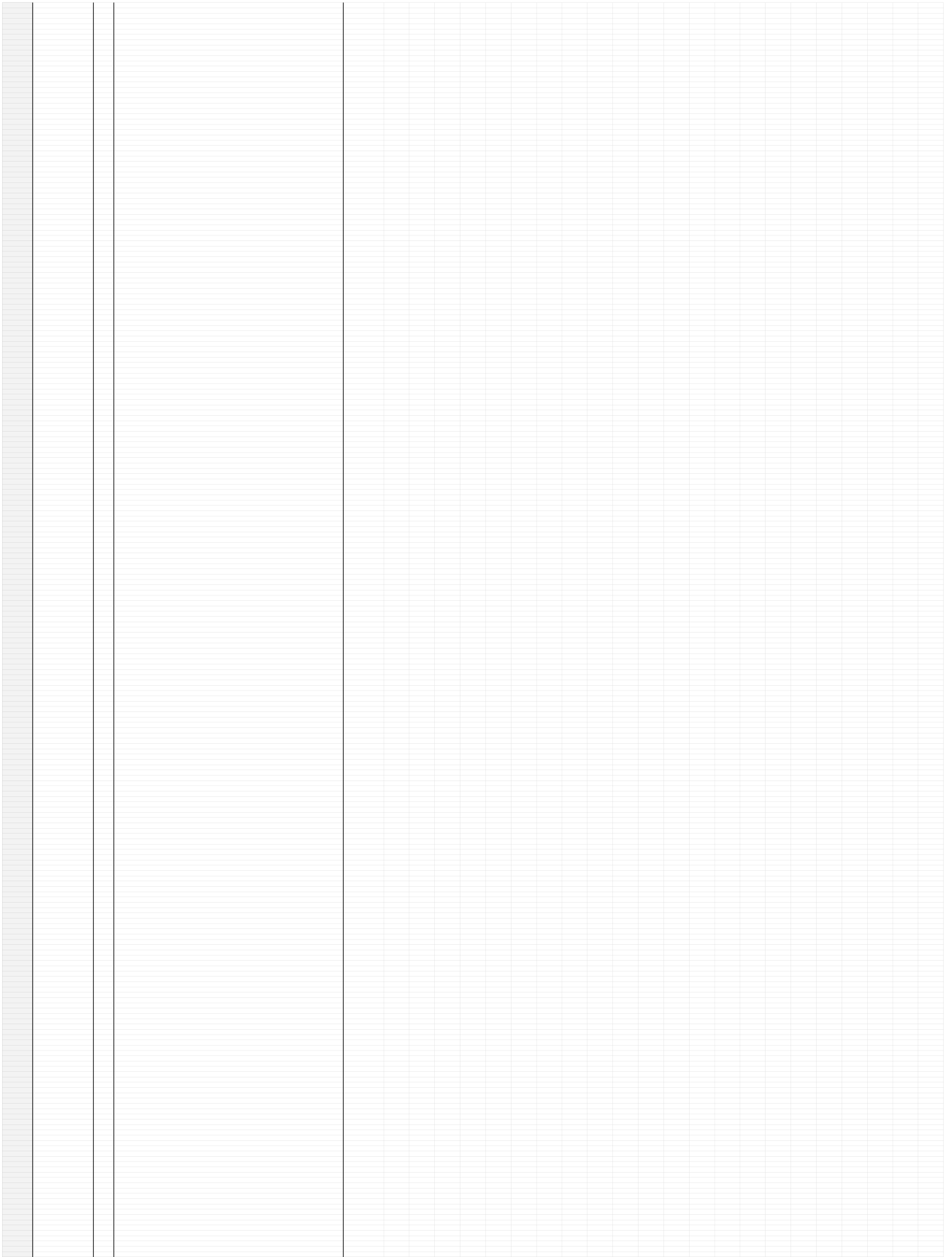

Survey questions:			
CAPACITY AND HEALTH SERVICES: Does each facility have a plan in place for separating suspected COVID cases, especially vulnerable individuals, and the rest of the population? How has existing and planned medical capacity changed due to COVID-19?			
HOSPITALIZATION: What is the pathway for getting incarcerated people necessary hospital-level care, for instance if they may need a ventilator? What is the security protocol? Has it been adapted for this pandemic?			
EQUIPMENT: Does the facility have access to ventilators or respiratory support on site? Have facilities ordered or received additional medical-grade PPE in preparation for an outbreak? If so, what supply does the DOC/facility anticipate having? How many COVID-19 tests are available within the DOC and how long will it take to get results? Where will they be processed?			
STAFFING: What is the usual ratio of healthcare staff to the incarcerated population? How much has the usual ratio changed due to COVID-19, for example because of staff calling out sick? How is the DOC preparing for a significant portion of the staff to be exposed and likely needing to take sick leave?			
PRIORITIES: What are the DOC's most immediate priorities in preparing or planning for a COVID-19 outbreak? Are there additional concerns I have not asked about that we should know about?			

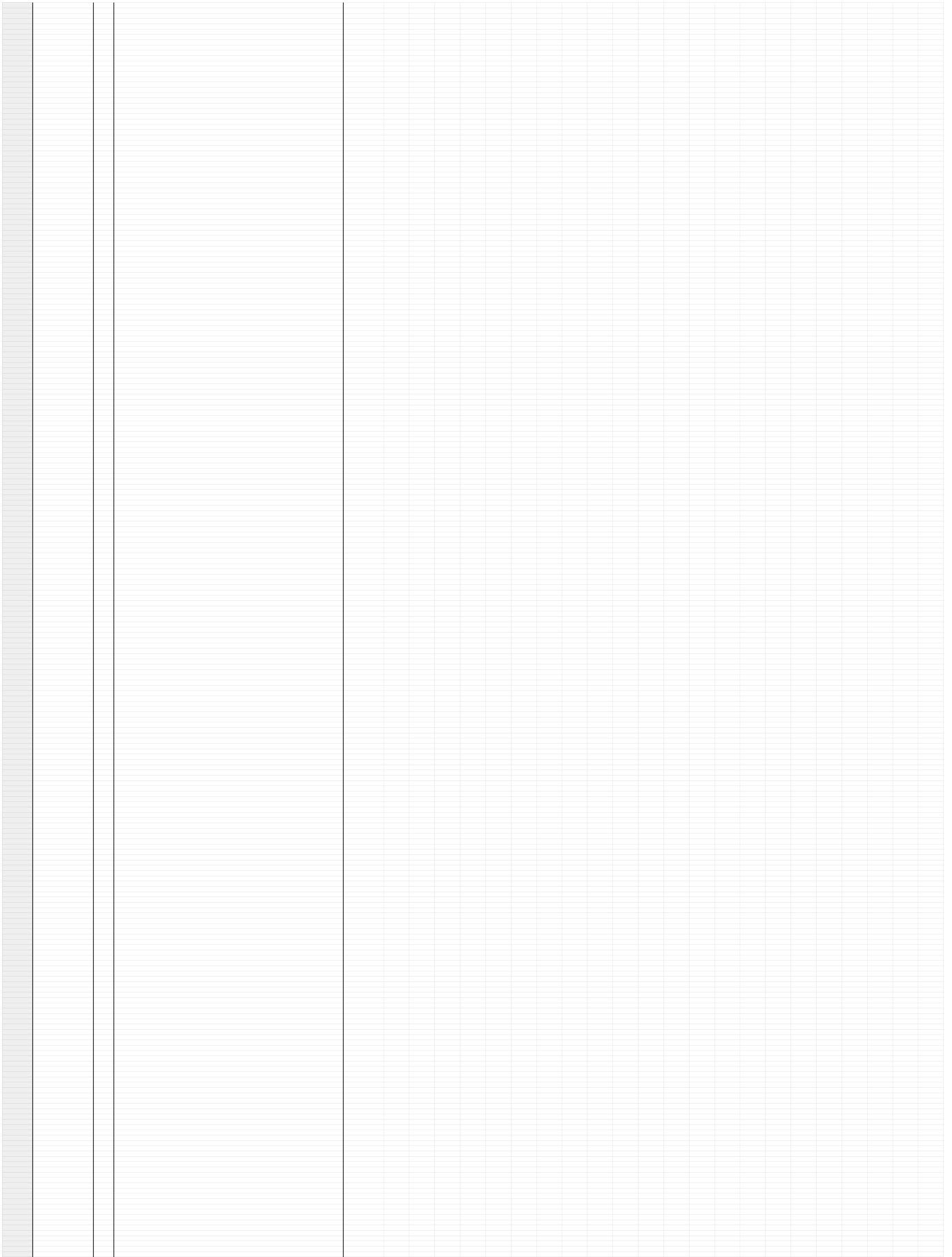


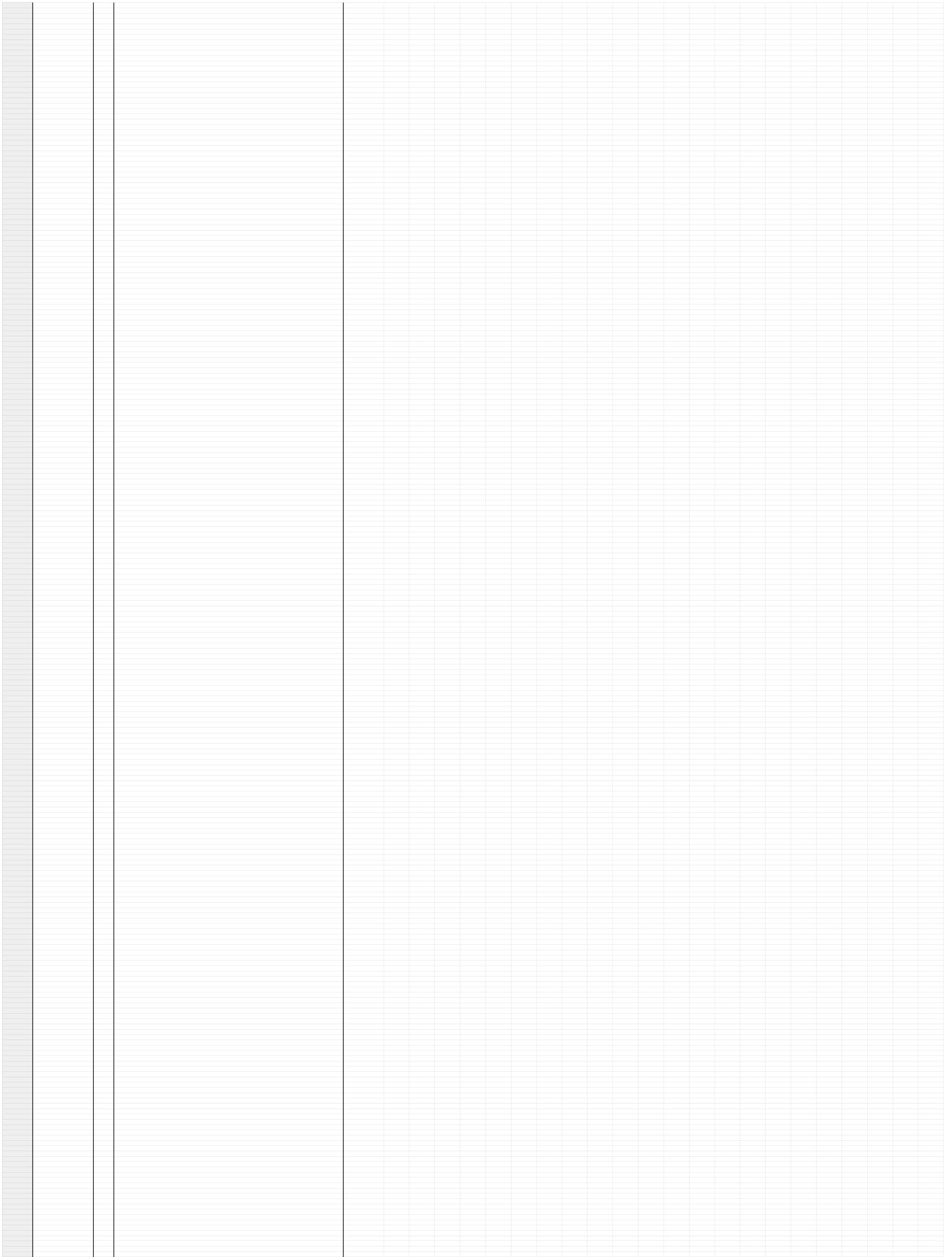


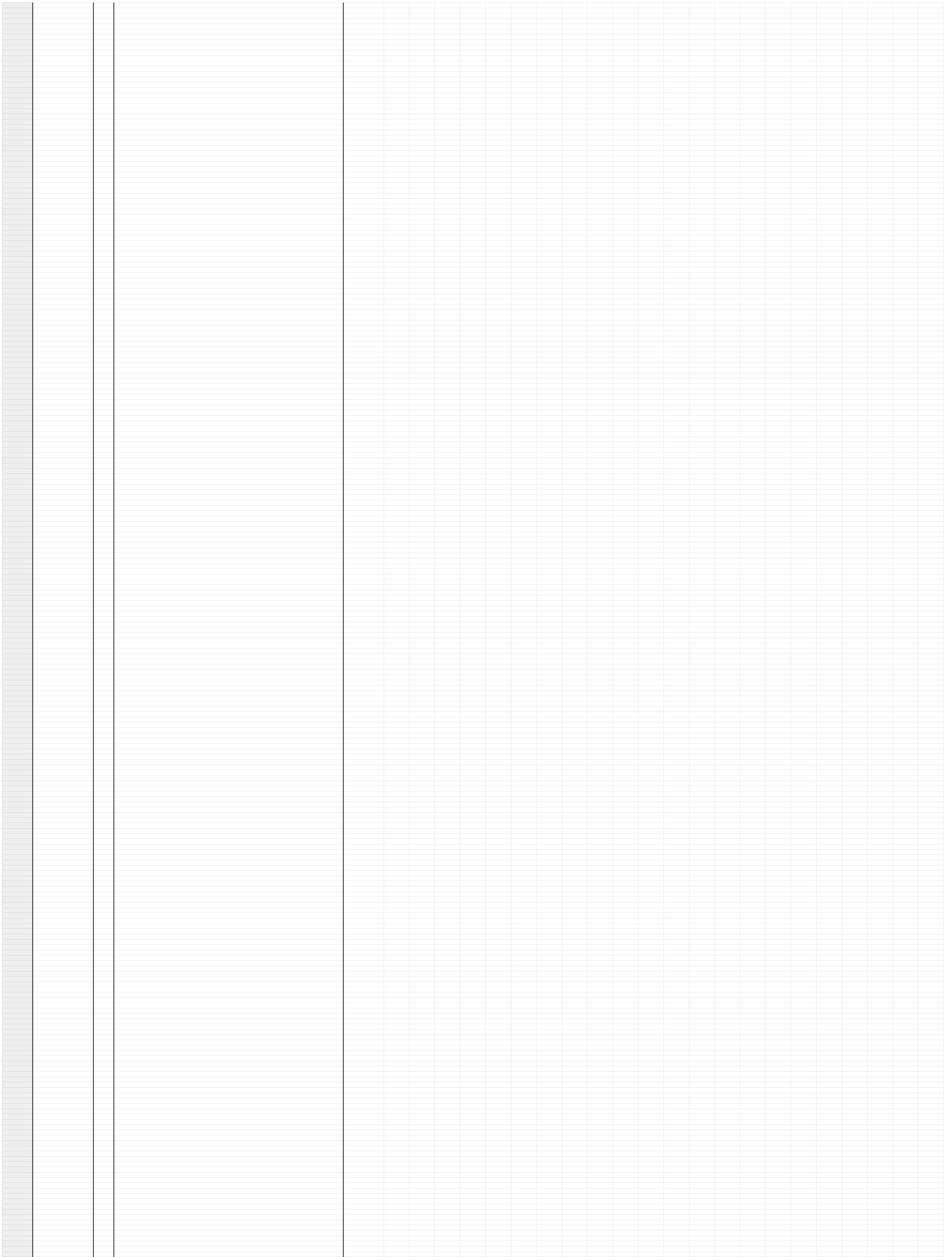


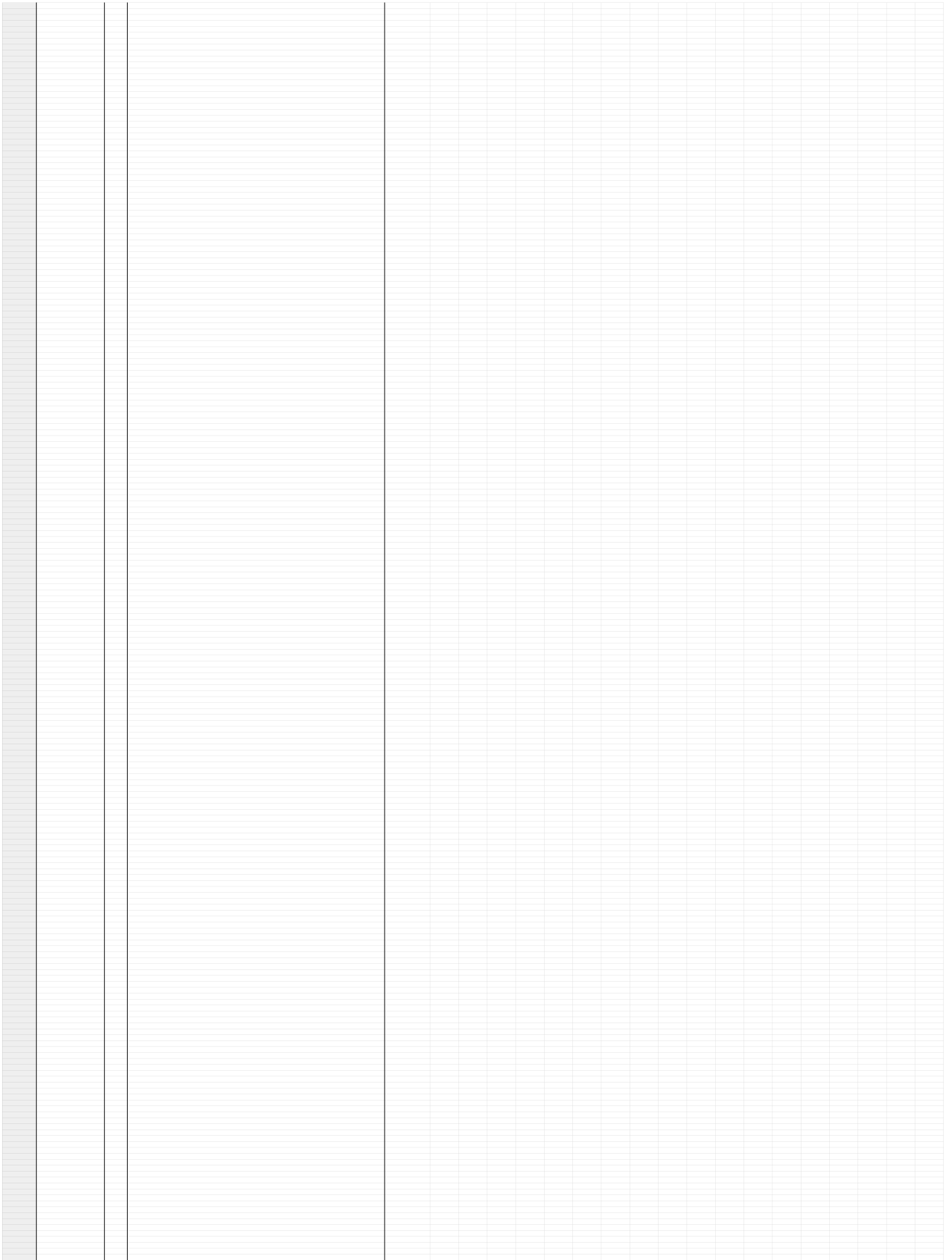

Staff ratios remain in inmate segregation and support facilities remain the same for patients in our facilities.
