Tax note: most of these aren't deducted the day you pay them. The truck and equipment depreciate (often deductible in full the first year under Section 179), and costs you pay before opening day are "startup costs" with their own first-year rules. Two minutes with a CPA before you file is worth it here. Keep every receipt either way.

Home Office Deduction Log

Your truck is the kitchen, but the books, the event calendar, and the payroll probably happen at home. First check that the space qualifies, then pick the bigger deduction.

Qualifies (exclusive and regular business use):

- ✓ A spare room or marked-off area used only for the business
- ✓ Where you do the books, schedule events, and run payroll, with no other fixed office
- ✓ A separate structure (garage office, studio) used regularly for work
- ✓ An area used regularly to store dry goods, serveware, or equipment

Does NOT qualify:

- ✗ The kitchen table or family den you also use personally (fails exclusive use)
- ✗ A guest room that's an office sometimes and a bedroom other times
- ✗ A space you use only now and then (fails the regular-use test)

How you lose the deduction: using the office for anything personal. One family movie night in the home office and the whole room fails the exclusive-use test. Keep it business-only.

Method 1 - Simplified (no receipts needed)

IRS Publication 587. \$5 per square foot, up to 300 sq ft. Maximum \$1,500.

Square feet of your home office (cap at 300):	150
Simplified deduction (sq ft x \$5, capped at \$1,500):	\$750.00

Method 2 - Actual expenses (usually the bigger deduction)

Enter home and office square footage. The sheet calculates business-use % and applies it to every line. No cap.

Home sq ft (total):	2,000
Office sq ft (used only for business):	150
Business use % (auto = office / home):	7.50%

Business Mileage Log

IRS Publication 463. Four fields per trip is all the IRS needs. 2026 business rate: \$0.725 per mile.					

Counts as business miles (deductible at the standard rate):

| | ✓ Personal car or van runs to the prep kitchen, Restaurant Depot, or the bank |
| | ✓ Driving your car to scout an event site or meet an event organizer |
| | ✓ Supply runs between the prep kitchen and the truck's parking spot |
| | ✓ Picking up ingredients, propane, or packaging in your personal vehicle |

Does NOT go in this log:

| | ✗ The food truck itself, if you deduct its actual costs (fuel, repairs, insurance) on the tracker |
| | ✗ Personal errands, even in a vehicle you also use for work |
| | ✗ The personal share of a trip that mixed business and personal stops |

One vehicle, one method: for each vehicle you pick either the standard mileage rate OR actual expenses, not both. Most food trucks run actual expenses on the truck (it's a rolling kitchen with real repair bills) and the standard rate on the personal car doing supply runs.

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
