Upon program completion, students may be eligible to sit for the state Certified Nurse Assistant written and skills exam to become a licensed Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA). CNAs work under the supervision of licensed nursing professionals. CNA's are the health professionals that patients encounter most often. They are a very important part of the Health Care Team.

CNA's are qualified to care for patients in:

- Assisted Living Centers
- Long Term Care Centers
- Home Health Agencies
- Hospitals

The primary duty of a CNA is for direct patient care including:

- Attending to daily needs such as bathing and other tasks for hygiene
- Assisting patients with eating difficulties
- Helping patients with range of motion exercises
- Recording and monitoring vital signs
- Remaining alert for any changes in the patient's behavior or condition that might signal that the patient is having any trouble.

Students are trained under the direction of a licensed nurse in a patient's physical, emotional, and social care. This program will cover:

- Professional ethics
- Basic safety and emergencies
- Communication skills
- Body mechanics
- Nutrition
- Patient mobility
- Restorative care
- Vital signs
- Infection control
- Body systems and diseases
- Personal care of the patient
- The patient's environment

Both classroom theory and clinical experience in a health care facility are provided. The clinical experience may not be scheduled at the same time as class. Health Care Provider BLS and First Aid certifications through the American Heart Association are included in the program.
