<p>The Gateway is a student-run campus newspaper and the only student-run media organization at the University of Alberta. The Gateway covers events on campus, U of A and Students' Union governance, the achievements of students and academics, and SU elections. The Gateway also provides students a platform to voice their opinions on important issues.</p> <p>The U-Pass program provides universal transit access across Edmonton and six surrounding municipalities at a significantly reduced rate, providing more affordable transportation access to students and encouraging the use of public transit. The current U-Pass deal expires in August of 2021, and so a referendum is being held to renew the U-Pass program.</p> <p>The U-Pass will cost University of Alberta undergraduate students \$180 per semester for the years 2021-2025. The negotiated agreement will see no fee increase for the entire 4-year contract. The University of Alberta will no longer be subsidizing the U-Pass cost.</p> <p>Generally, students cannot opt out of this fee: all full-time and part-time undergraduate students participate in the U-Pass program and pay the full fee, with the exception of Augustana students and students whose course locations are designated as online, as defined by the Registrar's Office. Under certain circumstances, some undergraduate students will be exempt or eligible to opt out of the U-Pass program. As an undergraduate engineering student, you are currently charged a Faculty Association Membership Fee (FAMF) of \$10.00 per semester. The proposed renewal of the membership fee of \$10.00 per student, per semester will provide engineering student groups with access to funding.</p> <p>The membership fee will also help fund events and initiatives such as the ESS Career Fair, CAREERS Week, mental health workshops, and professional development workshops. Additionally, the membership fee funds student group activities such as vehicle project groups, engineering related advocacy groups, and philanthropic initiatives.</p> <p>The conditions of the fee shall include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. It shall be distributed according to the framework approved by the University of Alberta Students' Union Students' Council and is subject to the oversight of the Audit Committee. 2. The fee will have a three (3) year lifetime with an expiry of August 31, 2024. <p>Do you support a Faculty Association Membership Fee renewal for Engineering Students' Society at \$10.00 per student, per semester, effective September 1, 2021?</p>	<p>The Organization for Arts Students and Interdisciplinary Studies (OASIS), the official representative body for all undergraduate students within the Faculty of Arts, is proposing a Faculty Association Membership Fee (FAMF) of \$3.00 per student per fall and winter semester for all undergraduate Arts students (part-time and full-time) starting in September 2021.</p> <p>The money received from the proposed FAMF would be returned to students as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 50% of FAMF funds will be allocated for the purpose of granting to departmental associations, student groups, and individual students. 2. 20% will be allocated to hosting and supporting events in celebration of the Faculty of Arts and its students. 3. 30% will be allocated to providing services to Arts students to improve experience during undergraduate careers. 4. Any funds remaining will be placed in a savings account for usage at a later date. <p>The proposed FAMF would start in September 2021 and cease April 2024. Financial Oversight of the Fee would be conducted by OASIS in accordance with existing financial practices outlined in the OASIS Constitution and UALSU Bylaws. Undergraduate students in the Faculty of Arts will be able to opt out of the fee by notifying OASIS through email or in person by the second week of the relevant semester.</p> <p>Questions: Do you support a Faculty Association Membership Fee for OASIS at \$3.00 per student, per term, beginning collection in September 2021 and ending in April 2024?</p>	<p>Funds from the Golden Bears & Pandas Legacy Fund (Dedicated Fee) shall be distributed to the University of Alberta varsity athletic teams and the Athletics Department for the purposes of ensuring varsity athletic teams for the purpose of raising and subsidizing varsity athletic teams and for the promotion of varsity athletics. 	<p>The Students' Union Building (SUB) is a key asset for students at the University of Alberta. Beyond being a place on campus to meet with your friends, study, grab lunch, or catch a movie, SUB revenues provide more than \$3 million in funding each year to support student services and initiatives, in addition to creating hundreds of job opportunities on campus.</p> <p>As a non-academic space on campus, SUB is not eligible for direct government capital grants—yet still requires more than \$25 million to address accumulating deferred maintenance costs. This maintenance needs to be addressed in order to ensure its sustainability and value to students—as both a social space and an important revenue source. The University of Alberta Students' Union (UASU) proposes to create a permanent Sustainability and Capital Fund to help provide funding that allows for the renovation and improvement of Students' Union-controlled spaces on campus like SUB. The Capital and Sustainability Fund would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide funding for projects that improve the environmental, economic, and/or social sustainability of Students' Union spaces; • Provide up to \$10,000 of funding for each approved student sustainability project that will positively impact the campus community. Students' Council would be responsible for approving all expenditures from the Fund. All Fund projects must demonstrate a clear contribution to environmental, economic, and/or social sustainability. The Fund would be financed by a fee subject to the following rules: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The fee will be initially set at \$25/term; • Students' Council may reduce the fee if financial circumstances allow; • The fee will be reviewed after five years; and • The fee will be applied to students enrolled in Fall, Winter, and Intercession (Spring/Summer) terms; • The fee can only increase according to the Alberta inflation rate; • Augustana will be exempt from the fee. <p>Do you support the creation of a Sustainability and Capital Fund to be implemented in the Fall 2020 academic year?</p>	<p>The fee will increase from \$3.54/semester to \$5.50/semester per semester per student, to be assessed to students enrolled in the Fall and Winter semesters.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students enrolled in Spring/Summer semesters will pay a fee which will increase from \$0.54/semester to \$1.50/semester • Off-campus students will pay the fee • Part-time students will pay the full fee • Students may opt-out of paying the fee. <p>Do you support these changes to The Gateway's fee?</p>	<p>Funds from the Golden Bears & Pandas Legacy Fund Dedicated Fee Unit shall be distributed to University of Alberta varsity athletic teams and the Athletics Department for the purposes of saving and stabilizing varsity athletic teams and for promotion of varsity athletics. Annually, CREF distributes approximately \$290,000 in grant funding for recreation at the University of Alberta.</p> <p>The conditions of the fund will include: 1. Students may not opt out of this fee; 2. The fee will be assessed to each fulltime and parttime student. The fee will be assessed in each of the fall, winter, and spring/summer semesters. 3.
