9/18/2017		<a href="#">Here</a>	"Near the Fon du Lac Reservation, at the frontline camp, Makwa, water protectors, land defenders, warriors, and others have participated in a wave of civil disobedience that has resulted in 16 arrests in multiple actions that have delayed construction work on the pipeline in the last month. On the morning of September 18, Unicorn Riot covered another direct action to stop construction on the Wisconsin side of the Minnesota-Wisconsin border."
1/12/2018	Duluth	<a href="#">Here</a>	Protesters shut down the Wells Fargo bank in downtown Duluth on Friday morning when three men in a crowd of about three-dozen protesters locked themselves to entrances for the bank.
6/28/2018		<a href="#">Here</a>	On Thursday morning, before the PUC decision was announced, protesters set up a "tripod" blockade, shutting down the street outside the state regulatory agency's office.
6/3/2019		<a href="#">Here</a>	On Monday, June 3, 2019 three water protectors shut down work on power lines along the proposed Enbridge Line 3 tar sands oil pipeline by locking themselves to construction equipment.
10/4/2020		<a href="#">Here</a>	Activists hoisted a massive banner reading " <b>No KKKops, No Pipelines</b> " above Hiawatha Avenue on Sunday, October 4.
11/18/2020	15 miles N of Park Rapids	<a href="#">Here</a>	Police reported that people appeared to be tampering with heavy equipment, while others held flags and banners while yelling against Line 3. "... two chained themselves to a piece of equipment and refused to leave. Eventually officers used cutting tools to free them from the equipment and take them into custody."
11/27/2020		<a href="#">Here</a>	Water protector locks to Enbridge Line 3 pipe yard gate on #BlackFriday!
12/4/2020	Cloquet	<a href="#">Here</a>	Water protectors blocked pipeline traffic and climbed and occupied trees as part of Friday's actions. [Tree sit lasted 11 days]
12/10/2020		<a href="#">Here</a>	2 Water Protectors locked themselves to a Line 3 pipe truck bound for the Willow River crossing east of the Mississippi River. In honor of American Indian Movement co-founder Dennis James Banks, who passed away on October 29, people took and held space in the middle of Cedar Avenue in Minneapolis on Saturday, November 5 slightly after 11 p.m. CDT. The shutdown was also an action in solidarity with resistance to the proposed new Line 3 pipeline in northern Minnesota.
12/15/2020	Minneapolis	<a href="#">Here</a>	Water protector Emma Harrison was arrested Monday in Backus, Minnesota after successfully obstructing construction on Enbridge Energy's Line 3 pipeline project for several hours by ascending a tripod in front of a tar sands pipe yard owned by the Canadian company.
12/28/2020		<a href="#">Here</a>	Water protectors were arrested Thursday after halting construction at a Minnesota worksite for Enbridge's Line 3 project by locking themselves together inside a pipe segment.
1/14/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	This morning in Northern Minnesota, two water protectors locked down to one another between barrels of concrete on a road leading to a #Line3 construction work site.
1/29/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	This morning, 8 water protectors locked to one another with barrels of concrete & a piano blockaded an Enbridge fueling station & #Line3 pipeline worksite as dozens more held space.
2/4/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	Today four people calling themselves the "Four Necessity Valve turners" shut down Enbridge's Line 3 and Line 4 tar sands oil pipelines in Minnesota citing "imminent and irreversible damage being done to the planet." The activists entered pipeline service locations and advised Enbridge of their intention to stop the flow of oil by shutting down the safety valves. Enbridge eventually manually shut down both the Line 3 and 4 tar sands pipelines.
2/4/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	On February 10, 2021, two people, including Dylan Bremner, locked down to a digger on a work site.
2/10/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	Three water protectors lock down inside line 3 pipeline for >6 hours
2/16/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	"On Friday, February 19, a family-friendly caravan disrupted traffic at several Line 3 construction routes. During the event, authorities announced a baseless bomb threat via FEMA's Wireless Emergency Alerts system."

2/24/2021		<a href="#">Here</a>	A water protector named Rose sat atop a 40-foot bipod on the west end of the road, and about five miles to the east, water protectors Big Wind and Danny locked down to a flipped-over car. Both blockades prevented workers from entering and exiting the work sites for over five hours.
