Equality Fund	At the Equality Fund, we robustly resource women's rights organizations and feminist movements worldwide by partnering with organizations, coalitions, and networks focused on building power with women, girls, and trans people, especially in the Global South. We ground our work in mutual trust, respect, and collaboration. We recognize and celebrate that we are one part of a growing ecosystem of feminist funders. Our goal is to complement and accelerate the vibrant expansion of this space, exponentially increasing investment in women's rights organizations and feminist movements working from the grassroots level to the regional and global stage. Foundation for Middle East Peace (FMEP)	FMEP is a hybrid grant-maker and think-tank. We are proud that FMEP funds today, and has funded for the past 40 years, in Palestine and for Palestinian rights and freedom. We work closely with long-term and new partners on the ground to support their efforts on the frontlines of the struggle for rights and freedom, and to build/reinforce a strong, resilient civil society. In addition to our grants, we support our partners on the ground by amplifying their voices in our public programs and cultivating additional funding partners to enhance their work. Our current funding priorities are: promoting respect for human dignity and accountability for violations of international law, combatting the weaponization of the Israeli-Palestinian issue & false accusations of antisemitism; elevating new thought leaders; enriching the public and political discourses by creating, expanding, and defending space for both criticism of Israeli policies and actions, and for Palestinian voices; and enabling Palestinians to remain in Palestine despite increasing efforts to displace them from their land, homes, and communities. We are a 501(c)3 private operating foundation and we invite philanthropists to join us in supporting our grantees, either alongside FMEP or in direct partnership with FMEP. The fund's grantmaking decisions are made by a network of over 215 Global South activists and advisors, located in the countries where we grant, who are embedded in local environmental justice struggles, such as social change leaders, human rights activists, and environmental lawyers. GGF has been funding in Palestine for 2 decades, with a large majority of that funding going through partners. Our long-term partnership model means we support partners for the long-haul. We also provide emergency funding, learning exchange grants and infrastructure grants. For decades, states and international organizations have sustained a top-down model of emergency response that undermines local priorities and solutions, stripping away agency from communities. Rawa	Rawa is a Palestinian initiative working toward liberatory and resilient grassroots-led organizing across historic Palestine. Rawa advocates for the liberation of Palestinian resources from the domination of international funding and for the independence of local decision-making. According to decisions made by community activists from across Gaza, the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and within Israel/48, Rawa supports over 50 grassroots groups, reaching many otherwise unfunded initiatives. Beyond grants, Rawa works to build sustainable community support networks that can return a sense of collective self-reliance based in local forms of giving, mutual aid, and volunteerism eroded by decades of oppression. The Emergent Fund	Emergent Fund is a queer women of color-led, movement-aligned participatory grantmaker with intersectional, collective liberation values moving rapid response grants to organizers and movement organizations every single month, often in as little as one week. Our advisory council of grant decision-makers—all people of color and Indigenous organizers—come from directly impacted communities committed to building movement and transforming crisis into change. We have long funded Palestinian-American, anti-Zionist Jewish and Muslim led organizations. During this time, in addition to publicly speaking out, flanking our grantees, and engaging in philanthropic organizing, we have also already moved rapid response grants to twenty (20) organizations with both C3 and C4 dollars. The Jewish Liberation Fund aims to break the silencing practices of many Jewish funders, by activist-led funding decisions, organizing our peer institutions, and being a power-building ally for the movements we support. Pillars Fund	Pillars Fund amplifies the leadership, narratives, and talents of Muslims in the United States to advance opportunity and justice for all. We envision a society where Muslims have access to every opportunity, are free to fully embody all of their identities, and are empowered to pursue their greatest aspirations. Since our founding in 2010, Pillars has distributed more than \$9M in grants to Muslim organizations and leaders who advance social good. We invest in community-focused initiatives, push back against harmful narratives, uplift Muslim stories, and give collectively to generate resources within Muslim communities for Muslim communities. In 2023, we are providing rapid response funding and support for U.S.-based Muslim-led nonprofit organizations who are challenging growing anti-Muslim discrimination, providing communal mental health support, and calling on U.S.-based elected leaders to demand a ceasefire in Gaza and to affirm rights here in the U.S. Some examples include: - Providing legal protection for college students who have been doxxed and harassed for their Palestine advocacy - Publishing mental health resources for practitioners and community members - Conducting community self-defense workshops - Hosting know-your-rights trainings for participants in public demonstrations or in case of law enforcement abuse - Equipping and mobilizing community members to call on elected leaders to demand a ceasefire and to halt legislative initiatives that would further prohibit Palestinian-Authority-passport holders from entering the U.S. - Challenging censorship on social media platforms and rampant misinformation in the mainstream media			pillarsfund.org	United States	Yes
RISE Together Fund	RISE Together Fund is the only national donor collaborative exclusively dedicated to supporting Black, African, Arab, Middle Eastern, Muslim, and South Asian (BAMEMSA) movements to build a just, inclusive and multiracial democracy in the U.S. RTF was founded in 2008 in response to escalating anti-Muslim targeting, hate crimes, surveillance, detention and deportation, and xenophobia. In response to the siege and bombardment of Gaza, RTF is working in the US to support organizations dealing with a rise in fear, violence, censorship, retaliation and intimidation, and government abuse reminiscent of the post 9/11 environment. RTF is supporting organizations rapid response needs as they address hate incidents, media bias and censorship, and legal and policy advocacy related to lost job and educational opportunities for speaking out, and government suppression, surveillance and questioning, while also supporting the BAMEMSA field's physical and digital security needs.
