

The BIPOC-authored Social Work Papers spreadsheet is intended for use by instructors of undergraduate/graduate-level social work courses to help diversify their syllabi.

*This spreadsheet is modeled after the BIPOC-authored Psychology Papers, created by Erika Wojcik (ewojcik@skidmore.edu).

BIPOC stands for Black, Indigenous and People of Color. The term encompasses all people of color, but with emphasis on Black and Indigenous people to highlight the unique oppression they have faced due to white supremacy. Thus, this database is intended to include all authors who identify as people of color, but the hope is that Black and Indigenous authors are very well-represented.
