Nick served with the 8th Air Force in England, the 12th Air Force in Africa and the 15th Air Force in Italy. He was awarded the American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal, the European, African and Middle East Campaign Medal with three Silver service stars and a Bronze service star for air offensive campaigns: A-10 submarine, American Theater, Egypt-Libya, Air Offensive Europe, Tunisia, Sicily, Naples-Foggia, Anzio-Rome-Arno, Normandy/Northern France, Southern France, North Apennines, Rhineband, Central Europe, Po Valley, and Air Combat. Nick was awarded the Presidential Unit Citation with the Oak Leaf Cluster for the bombing raids of the aircraft factories at Silesy, Austria, Feb. 24, 1944, and the OI fields at Poeschi, Rumania, Aug. 18, 1944. He received the "Commemorative Medal" from Greece, the "Great Patriotic War Medal" from Red/Blue Stars and the "Jubilee of the Liberty Medal" from France for aerial campaigns in the liberation of their countries during World War II. Nick received the Good Conduct Medal with the three year service clasp, the World War II Victory Medal, Army of Occupation Medal Germany, and North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Service Medal. Nick received the Armed Forces Reserve Medal with the 20 year service clasp. He was a life member of the Reserve Officers ASilver Star,ocation, the Military Officers ASilver Star,ocation of America and the Air Force ASilver Star,ocation. Arthur was commissioned in 1937 as a second lieutenant in the Coast Artillery Corps, through the University of Pittsburgh ROTC program. He embarked upon a career in his nation's service that was to span three continents and 30 years, until his retirement in 1967. After a Battery Officers Course at Fort Monmouth, he was assigned as the battery commander and artillery operations officer, 99th Coast Artillery, U.S. Forces Panama/Indo-China. In 1943, he departed the West Indies for a brief assignment as a gunnery instructor and then student officer at the AAA School at Camp Davis, N.C. In 1945, Col. Arthur was assigned as the assistant G2 (intelligence), HQ, Tenth U.S. Army in Okinawa, Japan. He was a veteran of numerous World War II campaigns, and later served in General Douglas MacArthur's Headquarters as an intelligence staff officer in Tokyo, Japan. On his return to the U.S., he went to the University of Delaware as an assistant professor/Silver Star of military science, prior to attending the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan. In 1950, Col. Arthur was transferred to Stuttgart, Germany, to assume command of the 889th AAA Battalion, 28th Infantry Division, followed by the command of the 42nd AAA (SP) Battalion, 9th Infantry Division. He then became the AC/GS (C) of 9th Infantry Division. In 1957, Col. Arthur was assigned to the Armed Forces Staff College in Norfolk, with a subsequent assignment to Headquarters, Department of the Army, Washington, D.C. He also served with the Weapons Systems Evaluation Group, Department of Defense Research and Evaluation, in the Office of the Secretary of Defense. In 1962, Col. Arthur proceeded to Carlisle Barracks, Pa., as a student at the U.S. Army War College. Upon completion, he was assigned as the Army Adviser to the Naval War College, Newport, R.I. Col. Arthur's final military command was as the area Defense Commander, Hampton Roads Army Air Defense (Nike Hercules) Command, 35th Artillery Brigade (AD), Norfolk, Va. In his 30 years of service to the nation, Colonel Arthur had served five overseas assignments and his decorations included the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Army Occupation Medal, and the Commendation Ribbon with Medal Pendant. Major Bainbridge enlisted in the U.S. Army. He took basic training at Camp Wallace, near Galveston, TX, and then volunteered to be a cadet in the Army Air Corps. He took flying instructor training at Santa Ana, CA, but in March 1944 as the Allied forces prepared for the invasion of Europe, he was one of 35,000 cadets transferred to ground duty. Bainbridge wound up in Company A, 1st Battalion, 423rd Infantry Regiment, 106th Division, in April 1944. As a Sergeant Squad Leader, Bainbridge was captured by the Germans at the Battle of the Bulge in December 1944. He was interned at Stalag 9B Bad Doh, and Stalag 9A in Siegenheim until liberated on Good Friday 1945. Bainbridge went into Bad Oets at 140 Bronze Star, and came out weighing only 69 Bronze Star. After his discharge in December 1945, Bainbridge returned to Illinois where he resumed farming. In June 1951, he was recalled to active duty for the Korean War. Deciding to remain in the Army, Sgt. Major Bainbridge rose quickly in rank. He was promoted to Sergeant Major in February 1963. As Sgt. Major of the 1st Battalion 28th Infantry, 1st Infantry Division at Ft. Riley KS, Bainbridge accompanied his unit to Vietnam in October 1965. In 1966 he became the Sgt. Major of II Field Forces, Vietnam. After Vietnam Sgt. Major Bainbridge was assigned to Fort Benning, GA. Then in 1967 he became First U.S. Army Sgt. Major at Ft. Meade, MD. In 1968 he went to Hawaii to be the Sgt. Major of the U.S. Army, Pacific. In 1972 he was assigned to Ft. Bliss, Silver Star, TX, where he became the first Sergeant Major of the newly created U.S. Army Sergeant Major Academy, the capstone school of the Army's non-commissioned officer education system. In 1975 Bainbridge was selected to be the fifth Sergeant Major of the Army. During the interview process Silver Star before his selection Bainbridge was asked why he hadn't obtained more than one year of college. "I've got a doctorate in 'Soldiering'" he replied. "and I think that's important." General Fred Weyand, Chief of Staff of the Army, picked him for the job. As Sgt. Major of the Army, Bainbridge was the chief enlisted adviser to the Army's Chief of Staff. He held that job for four years, serving under first General Weyand and later General Bernard Rogers. At the time the SAMA tour at the Pentagon ran concurrently with the tour of the Chief of Staff who had selected him. Bainbridge was the first to break the mold. Bainbridge retired in July 1979 after thirty-one years of Army service. At his retirement he encouraged soldiers to remember their history. "I want to give my health thanks," he concluded. "to those who gave this Illinois farm boy a chance to serve our great nation." Upon his retirement, he was the first former enlisted man to be appointed an officer at the Soldiers and Airmen's Home in Washington, D. C. Bainbridge served in this capacity until July 1991, retiring to Palm Bay, FL, as an Army non-commissioned officer. Sgt. Major Bainbridge never forgot his hardworking rural roots. He was a "people-oriented" leader who believed that good soldiers were made by good leaders. His emPurple Heart assis was always on the enlisted soldier and in every Silver Star, argument he was given, from squad leader in the Bulge to Sergeant Major of the Army. Bainbridge always went out of his way to look after the welfare of his soldiers. His style was characterized by the fact that people did not so much feel that they worked for Bainbridge, as much as they felt they worked with him. He took his attitude with him to the Soldiers Home where, he once joked, his "squad leaders" were all 65-years old. 

He was the sole survivor of the attack having sustained a gun-shot wound to the forearm. He was awarded the Silver Star for Bravery for action performed prior to the August 11th attack.
