Unbreakable Tie of 2011: Marion Mauders vs. Bakerwell Tarts	Tied 12:17 slowwacky points each, followed by a week of extra time which was scoreless. In keeping with tradition, best-of-5 Scrabble tournament was played by the two coaches. Deciding game was also tied when coach Seignary played 'Jackets' on a triple word score as his final move. Then Rock, Paper, Scissors was played against the captains, which was also tied after they played Rock 141 times in a row. Then the umpires declared the game an actual tie.
